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Communities in Schools of Indiana Kicks Off Back-to-School Effort with Scaling Initiative Expanding Resources and Supports to More Students

Additional services are scheduled begin at the start of the 2023-2024 school year

INDIANAPOLIS, IN — Communities in Schools of Indiana has been awarded funding to expand their integrated student supports model into nine more schools across the state- seven in Indianapolis and two in Lafayette.

The first round of funding distributed to affiliates nationwide totals \$13 million of the \$165 million Ballmer investment announced earlier this year. The funding is designed to catalyze local public and private investment in the model through a 1:1 match requirement over the first three years and commitments to sustain the work long-term. The Indiana state office will be receiving approximately \$1.2 million.

This investment enables Communities in Schools of Indiana to provide critical coordinated resources to students in their school buildings through a trained professional- a site coordinator-who can help connect them to supports and services needed to succeed in school.

With this new funding, CIS of Indiana will add two more schools in the Lafayette School Corporation (Amelia Earhart and Vinton Elementary schools), scale to all elementary schools in the MSD of Lawrence Township (Amy Beverland, Crestview, Forest Glen, Mary Castle, and Skiles Test), and support new site coordinators in the MSD of Decatur Township (at the new Decatur High Ability Academy and by adding a second site coordinator at Lynwood Elementary).

Expanded supports and resources will roll out to new and existing partners at the start of the 2023-2024 school year.

"The districts that partner with us want to ensure that all of their students have the tools they need to be successful academically, so they joined CIS of Indiana for this grant and committed to integrating these site coordinators into their schools," Executive Director Hadley Moore Vlahogeorge shared. "Kids can't learn if their basic needs aren't met. If a student is struggling with hunger, lack of access to medical care, or has no way to wash clothes- and these are just a few of the many common challenges we respond to- the site coordinator can ensure that child and that child's family are connected with needed resources in the safe, welcoming building they already go to every day."

Communities in Schools of Indiana is the state office of the national not-for-profit that ensures integrated student supports are available in schools so students, families, and community

members can access what they need to thrive. "We've been partners of these three amazing districts for many years; I'm thrilled they've committed to growing and sustaining the program in their schools. It's an honor to continue to serve their students, families, and stakeholders, and it demonstrates how invested they are in the continued success of their young people," Moore Vlahogeorge concluded.
